The post code is KY5 8BA


All registration, briefings and race starts are at the **Outdoor Education Centre** (OEC) which is the green wooden building, located on the left as you enter the park.

REGISTRATION & BRIEFING

Registration: All athletes must register in person at the allocated time.

Nails will be checked and numbers marked on back of hands.

No jewellery allowed

Registration pack includes:

- Numbered cap(s),
- 2 x electronic timing bands
- Numbered plastic bag

Briefings: To avoid over-crowding in the classroom, the majority of the safety information is included in the accompanying document.

- Please take the time to read this thoroughly before the event.
- A short briefing will also take place on the day as per the timetable.
- Attendance is mandatory at the briefing for each event in which you are participating (including relays).





WITHDRAWALS

SWIMWEAR/ WETSUITS

- For all Championship events, under SASA rules, the following applies:
 - Water temperature below 18C: wetsuits are mandatory
 - Water temperature between 18-20c: the use of wetsuits will be decided by the event organisers
 - Water temperature above 20c: no wetsuits allowed
- It is most unlikely that the water temperature will exceed 18c, so wetsuits will almost certainly be required. However, all athletes should bring appropriate swimwear (racesuit rather than training suit) in case of a non-wetsuit swim
- Please ensure you arrive with enough time to put your wetsuit on well before the swim.
 - All Novice Meet and Junior (1km) swimmers are advised to be changed into their wetsuits before the briefing, as the start of the first race will follow very quickly after the briefing.



COURSE MAP – Novice Events DISTRICT

 The course is a 100m 'there and back' starting from the far side of the pontoon:

• 200m events: 1 lap

• 400m freestyle: 2 laps

- There will be a line of purple, orange, yellow buoys marking the turning points.
- Each swimmer will be allocated a turning buoy. (with a maximum of three swimmers per buoy). Navigate in a clockwise direction i.e. keeping right shoulder to the buoys.
- Finish by touching the jetty.








COURSE MAP – 1/2km

- The course is a 1km circuit:
 - 1km: 1 lap
 - 2km: 2 laps
- There will be **orange buoys** marking the turning points. Navigate in a **clockwise** direction i.e. keeping right shoulder to the orange buoys.
- Pass **EITHER side** of the yellow 'relay' buoy
- Pass under the finish arch buoy at the end of each lap.
- Finish by touching the banner on the finish arch.







CHAIN RELAY EVENT

- Relay team lines (2M&O/ 2F) must be submitted by **14:00** on the day. Named reserves should also be submitted at this time. All swimmers must be registered with the same club (or same composite team).
- Relay swimmers will be numbered 1 to 4 in "drop off" order. All swimmers will start together in the water at the start of the event. The team will line up behind the lead swimmer at the start. The lead swimmer can be any one of the team. Swimmers in each team can swim in any order during each lap and can swap about.
- AT THE END OF EACH LAP: as you pass under the finish arch, the swimmer with the lowest numbered cap must be in the lead as the team passes between the Home buoy and the Jetty and will then drop off, leaving the remaining swimmers in that team to continue.
- The final swimmers (No 4) will touch the FINISH arch at the end of the fourth lap.





COURSE MAP – RELAY

- The course is a 250m circuit:
- Navigate clockwise passing the yellow buoy on right shoulder
- Final swimmer finishes by touching the banner on the **finish arch**.







PRESENTATIONS/ AWARDS

Presentations for the Novice Meet will take place following completion of all novice heats.

- Please note that the Novice Meet is not a District Championship event, and as such no District medals will be presented.
- Prizes will be presented to the fastest swimmers in each age group

Presentations for the Championships events will take place at the end of the day.

- Medals for the Championship events will be presented to the first to third swimmer (gold, silver, bronze) in each category and to the East District Champion (gold).
- Trophies will also be presented to the fastest East District male & open and female Junior (1km) and the fastest male & open and female Senior or Masters swimmer (not age adjusted) (2km)
- The Lawson Trophy will also be presented to the fasted overall East District swimmer across the longest event (2km)
