Temporary Members Only:

Entries will be accepted from swimmers who are not currently members of the SASA or another national governing body affiliated to World Aquatics, providing they submit a valid application for Temporary Membership and an additional fee of £10. Such applicants must first submit a Temporary Membership form here followed by the event entry form using the link at the top of this page. Where the entry is incomplete or the request does not comply with the Scottish Swimming rules, it will not be accepted.

- The Scottish National Champion as defined in Company Rule R4.5 (where the individual is not also the Open Champion, gold medallist).



EVENT CONDITIONS/REGULATIONS

Event Conditions / Regulations

Competitors may be required to submit to a medical examination prior to the event

Competitors must wear swimming caps provided

Competitors should be aware that swimming in open water events brings with it a small risk of contracting some water-borne diseases and they should contact their GP if they feel ill in the days following an event.

The organising committee reserve the right not to accept entries from swimmers who they believe may not be capable of completing the event within the cut off times:

- 500m 20 minutes
- 1km 30 minutes
- 2km 1 hour
- 5km 2 hours
- 10km 3 hours 15 minutes

Competitors still swimming on expiry of these times will be required to leave the water without completing the race.

Entry to all events is expressly subject to each and all of the conditions in this document and the regulations and may, where appropriate, also require compliance with the facility provider's regulations.

As with all Open Water events there is a risk that the event may not be able to go ahead due to weather or environmental factors.

No guarantee can be given by Scottish Swimming that the event will take place at a particular time or any particular date and Scottish Swimming reserves the right to reschedule the event without notice and without any liability for so doing.

The following are articles, which must not be brought to the venue: glass items, fireworks, smoke canisters, flares, glass bottles, weapons of any sort. Any person in possession of such items may be refused access at the absolute discretion of any steward or officer of Scottish Swimming and/or police officer.

No foul or abusive language, including racial or sexual abuse, may be used.

No alcohol may be consumed at the event.

No person may for commercial purposes take photographs or use any video recording equipment at the event without the express written permission of Scottish Swimming. The taking of photographs or use of video equipment for non-commercial purposes is permitted subject to compliance with Scottish Swimming Guidelines.

No articles, periodicals, publications, flyers or goods of any nature may be offered either free or for sale by any persons save only Scottish Swimming at the event without the express written permission of Scottish Swimming.

Any person attending the event must at all times comply with any and all reasonable instructions of any steward or officer of Scottish Swimming and/or police officer.

Scottish Swimming reserves absolutely the right to eject from events any person failing to comply with each and all of the Event Regulations.



General Information

Safeguarding	The primary safeguarding point of contact for the event in relation to wellbeing & protection matters or accidents is the event Meet Director. The secondary point of contact is the Scottish Swimming Safeguarding Manager. Further details will be issued in the Information Pack prior to the event.
Coach Accreditation	There will be a dedicated area at the event where only athletes, coaches and STOs will have access. To gain access a valid accreditation is required. Coaches please apply for your Annual Open Water Coaches Pass here .
Safety Briefing	There will be an online safety briefing before this year's event as well as a reminder of key information on the day. Attendance at both of these briefings is compulsory for swimmers. The online briefing will take place on Thursday 13 th June at 6.30pm and registers will be taken to make sure everyone has had the required information prior to the event.
Competition Disclaimer	In the event of cancellation or abandonment of the event, refunds if any, will be made at the absolute discretion of Scottish Swimming. Scottish Swimming will have no legal liability to make a refund or to pay any form of consequential or indirect damage such as loss of enjoyment, travel, catering and accommodation.

Any policy related matters that arise during the event should be reported to and will be recorded by the Meet Convenor/Chief Referee and these matters will be communicated to and managed post event by the relevant Scottish Swimming Staff. At no point will members be challenged on the day of a competition with any matters being resolved post event.

By entering the Female category, athletes are therefore confirming their birth sex is female and are eligible to compete in the Female category.
